COVID 19— IMPACT ON HOUSEHOLD FOOD SECURITY AND VULNERABILITY

In August 2020. WFP interviewed +5000 households via phone in all 7 provinces to assess the impact of COVID19 on livelihoods and food security.

WHAT WAS DONE?



4,614 random and **575** repeated households were interviewed





36% of the total survey respondents were female





The average size of households included in the survey is **5.12 people**





14.5% of households are female headed






Average age of the respondent is **35 years** old





KEY FINDINGS





6.7% of households did not have enough food to meet their needs




43.1% of children between 6-23 months of age did not meet minimum dietary diversification



2 in 3 households had food stocks



11% households reported job loss due to COVID-19



31.2% of households experienced income reduction



54% of households sources food through market purchase



Job loss and income reduction more common among daily wage labourers, households receiving remittance, small business and trade



Food insecurity more prevalent among households that experiences job and income loss, and female-headed

and illiterate households
